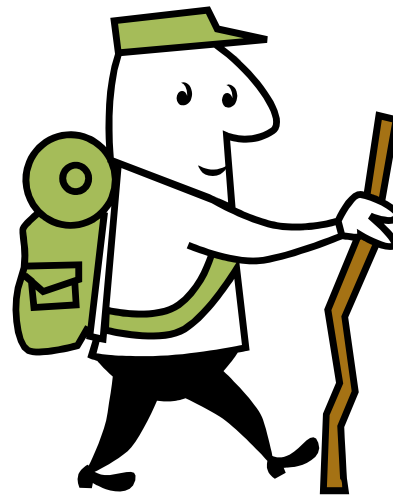

CYC Programs

CAMPERS

At Catholic Youth Camp, campers of all ages will enjoy traditional camp activities including archery, arts and crafts, canoeing, kayaking, fishing, drama, dance, sports and swimming. Campers will be placed in groups based on age and activities will be progressive to accommodate different skill levels. All camp activities such as large group games, songs, skits and theme activities will vary according to the weekly theme.

- **Settler** – Completed grades 1-3
- **Trailblazer** – Completed grades 4-6
- **Pathfinder** – Completed grades 7-9

TEENS

Youth too old for traditional camp can still enjoy the fun at Catholic Youth Camp.

- **Leaders-in-Training** is a 2-week program for youth who have completed grades 10-12. LITs will spend the first week of camp taking part in a variety of trainings about leadership, communications, teamwork, self-esteem building, conflict management, etc. The second week of their stay will give them an opportunity to put their leadership skills to the test as they assist counselors in leading campers through activities.
- **Work Crew** is for youth who have completed grades 10-12 and are looking for a volunteer experience. Youth can volunteer for one week or all summer. Work crew participants will spend their days helping out around CYC with a variety of maintenance tasks, and will enjoy free time joining in all-camp activities or on their own around camp. This is a great way to earn service hours and have a great volunteer experience at camp.
- **Leaders-in-Training 2** is for youth who have completed the LIT program. LIT2 will give youth an opportunity to further develop leadership skills they started in LIT. The first week of LIT2 will focus on leadership through group work and assisting younger campers. The second week of LIT2 will focus on service learning and personal development.

Individual and cabin activity choices include: archery, arts and crafts, canoeing, drama/dance, fishing, sports, swimming, and more! Campers choose their individual activities and are assigned with campers from their own age group.



Camp Store



Each day, campers will have a chance to visit the CYC store! Items such as t-shirts, sweatshirts, stuffed animals, backpacks, other souvenir merchandise, notepads, envelopes, stamps, bug spray, snacks, drinks, and water can be purchased at the Camp Store. Prices range from \$1-\$25.

You can deposit money into your child's Camp Store account by going to your online registration. Add funds under "Custom Payments" and indicate camp store in the memo field. You can also add funds by contacting our registrar at 651-636-1645. We ask that campers do NOT bring cash to camp. Cash will not be accepted at the store except on Family Day, although checks are preferred.

We suggest that campers have anywhere from \$5-\$50 in their store accounts. Camp store balances in excess of \$10 after camp can be refunded if the request is made in writing no later than October 31, 2009. Unclaimed funds or those with less than \$10 are donated to our CYC Camper Assistance Fund.

What to Bring to Camp!

Please remember that at camp, we get dirty, wet, spend time at arts and crafts (with paint, glue, etc.), and do a variety of activities that will cause clothes and shoes to come home much rougher than when they came to camp. Please don't send items that you expect to stay clean.

Transportation

Arrival at Camp

For Those Driving to Camp- Please plan to arrive at CYC at approximately 3:30pm on the first day of camp (Sunday). CYC staff will greet you when you arrive and instruct you where to park. Please go directly to the check-in table and have any medications ready to turn in.

For Those Taking the Bus to Camp- Please plan to arrive on Sunday prior to the check-in/load times indicated for your specific boarding location listed below.

- At the Roseville stop- The CYC Registrar will have a check-in table located on the parking lot sidewalk. For safety purposes, we ask that parents/guardians escort children to the check-in table and wait until they are properly checked in. Campers should remain on the sidewalk until instructed by CYC staff to begin boarding bus.
- At the Cambridge stop- For safety purposes, please have your children wait in your vehicle until the bus arrives. When CYC staff exit the bus, please escort your children to the waiting bus and remain until they are properly checked in and aboard the bus.

Transportation

Departure From Camp

For Those Driving to Camp- When picking up your children from CYC, please plan to arrive at 1:00 pm for the Family Day Celebration on the final day of camp. CYC staff will greet each vehicle and instruct you where to safely park. The Closing Ceremony will begin promptly at 1:15 pm.

PLEASE SIGN OUT YOUR CHILDREN WITH THEIR RESPECTIVE CABIN COUNSELORS PRIOR TO LEAVING CAMP.

For Campers Taking the Bus Home- Children will gather in the main camp area near Indianpoint Lodge immediately following the Closing Ceremony. The bus is scheduled to leave at 2:30 pm. Campers will board buses and attendance will be taken to confirm all are aboard.

PLEASE SIGN YOUR CHILDREN OUT WITH THE BUS CHAPERONES. At all stops, please arrive prior to the approximate return time listed below. The bus will wait until all departing campers are signed-out. Delayed parent arrivals delay the bus arrival to the next stop.

VERY IMPORTANT FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL CAMPERS!

Parents/Guardians- If you are having your children picked up by anyone other than you, please complete a PICK-UP AUTHORIZATION form and return it to CYC at least 48 hours prior to the pick-up time. We cannot release a child to a person other than the legal parent/guardian without this completed and signed form. Forms are available online or by calling 651-636-1645. *We cannot accept phone messages or notes provided by the pickup person at the pick-up point.*

Directions to Camp

From Minneapolis/St. Paul

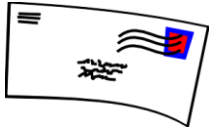
- Take MN 65-north through Cambridge and Mora to MN 210, just east of McGregor (approx. 110 miles north of Minneapolis)
- Turn Left at stop sign onto MN 210. MN 65 links with MN 210 at this point. Continue approx 1 mile.
- Turn right at stop sign on MN 65 and continue approx. 7 miles to County Road 14 (Sathers Amoco on your near right).
- Turn right on County Road 14; follow 5 miles to 520th lane.
- Turn Left on 520th lane (you should begin to see CYC signs at this point).
- Follow the signs on this road to camp (approx. 1 mile).

From St. Cloud, Minnesota

- Take MN 23-east through Foley and Milaca to US 169 North (approx. 25 miles).
- Bear left on US 169-north. Follow 8 miles past Aitkin to MN 210-east (approx 70 miles).
- Turn right onto MN 210 east and follow to McGregor, MN.
- Turn left at stop sign in McGregor. This is MN 65-north.
- Take MN 65 approx. 7 miles to County Road 14 (Sathers Amoco on your near right).
- Turn right on County Road 14; follow 5 miles to 520th lane.
- Turn Left on 520th lane (you should begin to see CYC signs at this point).
- Follow the signs on this road to camp (approx. 1 mile).

To set up a new account and visit our Online Community:

1. Go to our website at **www.cycamp.org**
2. Click the “Camp Photos & Camp Email” button located in the middle of the page*
3. Click the “Register Now” button
4. Enter your Pre-Approved Registration Code: **89313CMN**
5. Fill out all the required information
6. View camper pictures and send an email to your camper!

Frequently Asked Questions About Photos, Email and Care Packages

How do I view pictures?

Follow the instructions on the previous page for BUNK1, except, after registering, simply sign in and click on the Photo Gallery button. Photos are kept in folders found on the left side of the page below the words “Image Folders” Click on any folder to see the pictures within that folder. You can purchase prints or other photo gifts (t-shirts, mugs, etc.) of your favorite pictures. *There is no cost to view pictures.*

How do I send a Bunk Note (one-way email) to my camper?

After registering, simply sign in and click on the “Bunk Notes” button. Enter your camper’s name, type your message, and hit the “send” button.

Why do I have to pay to send Bunk Notes?

Each morning, the Bunk Notes system bundles and sorts the messages for us while protecting us from computer viruses. Your payment helps us cover the cost of the system, and frees us to be with your kids! Bunk Note credits vary in cost based on the package you purchase and the added features you request.

Can other relatives use these services?

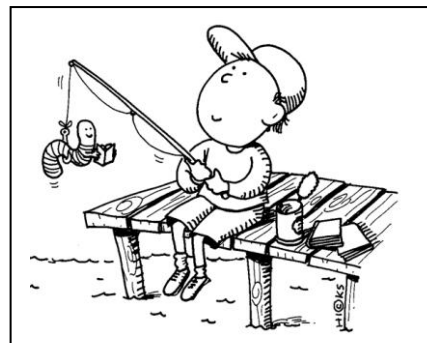
Certainly! Once you have set up your account, you will be able to invite other people to access these services by clicking the “Tell a friend” or “Invite Relatives” links.

What do I do if I lose my username and password?

You can get it online by clicking the “Need help” link on the lower left. You will receive an email with your username and password in a few minutes.

Can I also send a Care Package?

Yes, follow the steps after registering on Bunk1 to send a pre-packaged care package to your camper. Additional fees apply.



Catholic Youth Camp Code of Conduct

Catholic Youth Camp is committed to providing a safe and welcoming environment for all campers, staff and visitors. To promote safety and comfort for all, we ask all individuals (campers, staff, volunteers and visitors) to act appropriately, maturely, responsibly and respectfully at all times when they are in our facilities or participating in our programs. Our Code of Conduct does not permit language or any action that can hurt or frighten another person, or that falls below a generally accepted standard of conduct. These actions specifically include:

- Wearing inappropriate attire (clothing with vulgar/offensive words or graphics; clothing that reveals undergarments; or other as determined by camp staff).
- Using angry or vulgar language including swearing, name-calling, or shouting.
- Having physical contact with another person in an angry or threatening way.
- Harassing or intimidating by words, gestures, body languages or any other menacing behavior.
- Stealing or conduct which results in the destruction of property.
- Carrying or concealing weapons or devices or objects which may be used as weapons.
- Using or possessing illegal chemicals or alcohol on CYC property, in the CYC vehicles, or at any CYC sponsored programs.
- Displaying any other conduct of an inappropriate, threatening or offensive nature.

In addition to the above, the following behavioral expectations have been established for campers:

- Campers will treat their peers, CYC staff, volunteers and camp guests with respect at all times.
- Campers will remain in the presence of CYC staff at all times or have permission otherwise.
- Campers will follow directions of all CYC staff and designated volunteers.
- Campers may disagree with others, but they are expected to share their disagreement calmly and privately with the person or persons with whom they disagree.



CYC Behavior Guidelines

CYC embraces a respectful, supportive and inclusive environment where each camper and staff member can fully experience camp. We encourage campers to express themselves openly and honestly with other campers and staff. We understand that our campers and staff come from a wide variety of family environments, traditions and experiences. CYC considers behavioral situations as either Less Severe or Severe. We have determined consequences for these behaviors.

LESS SEVERE BEHAVIOR

- Not following directions of staff.
- Treating other people or property with disrespect.
- Swearing not directed at another person or said without intent to harm.

Any camper who exhibits LESS SEVERE behavior will receive the following consequences:

1. The camper will be redirected by staff as to the accepted behavior at CYC.
2. If the behavior continues the camper will sit out of the activity for 15 minutes as a way to assist the camper's focus. The counselor will take time to process with the camper before the camper returns to the activity. The staff will fill out a behavior form and turn this into the Director. A phone call or email with the parent(s) or guardian will take place from the Director.
3. In most cases after Step 1 and Step 2 have been utilized the majority of campers are able to meet the CYC expectations for a camper. However if the undesirable behavior persists, **it is now recognized as severe behavior**. The camper's parent(s) or guardian will be contacted and asked to pick up their child.

SEVERE BEHAVIOR

- Hitting, kicking, pushing, or any other form of physical abuse.
- Insubordination.
- Swearing aimed at another person.
- Leaving the immediate area of their camp group or refusing to leave when the group is ready to leave.
- Any type of threat or "bullying" behavior.

Any camper who exhibits any SEVERE behavior will be immediately removed from the activity and the camper's parents/guardians will be notified. The Director will review the situation with the counselor. The camper will meet with the Director to discuss the situation. The Director will determine the appropriate consequence for the camper in this situation. For the safety of all children, we ask that a parent or guardian is available via phone throughout the camp day for emergency and behavioral issues.

The following behaviors are considered extremely dangerous and will result in the immediate removal from camp:

- Possession and/or use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, narcotics, illicit drugs, drug-related paraphernalia and all other controlled substances.
- Possession and/or use of any type of weapon including, but not limited to guns, knives and martial arts types of weapons.
- Leaving the camp property or program area without the direct supervision and/or permission of staff.
- Any behavior that seriously compromises the safety and/or well being of any camper, staff, volunteer or guest.

These policies have been established using the American Camping Association guidelines and approved by the Catholic Youth Camp Board of Directors.

MEDICATION & ILLNESS PROCEDURES

CYC has a fully equipped Health Center that is staffed day and night by volunteer RN's, LPN's or other licensed medical personnel. All of our staff is certified in first aid and CPR. CYC is just 12 miles from the clinic in McGregor and 40 minutes from emergency room care in Aitkin.

If a camper requires medical attention beyond the care of our Health Center staff, he/she will be taken to the nearest medical facility. Parents will be notified immediately. A copy of the camper's medical insurance card is required with the Health History form, as all medical costs incurred will be the responsibility of the camper's family.

Medications: All medications must be listed on the Camp Health History form. Medications must be current, in the original container with the camper's name, the prescribing physician's name, the medication name, dosage, and administration times. All medications must be turned into the Health Director during health screening on arrival day. For the protection of all campers at CYC, all medications will be stored in the Health Center. The Health Director will dispense medications as directed.

Please note: The Health Center stocks non-prescription pain relievers, allergy medications, and topical lotions for rashes and minor abrasions. Non-prescription/over-the-counter medications will be provided and administered by the camp based on the Health Director's recommended treatment procedures. CYC discourages participants from bringing over-the-counter/non-prescription medications. When it is necessary to send non-prescription medications, please have them in their original package/bottle and list them on the Camper Health History form.

Your child(ren) should not attend camp if they are displaying any of these symptoms:

- **FEVER:** If over 100, or accompanied by other symptoms such as diarrhea
- **RESPIRATORY PROBLEMS:** Severe congestion, or unexplained wheezing that occurs suddenly
- **VOMITING:** If accompanied by other symptoms such as abdominal pain, behavior change, diarrhea or fever
- **SORE THROAT:** If accompanied by other symptoms (fever/ coughing) or lasting for more than 12 hours
- **RASH:** If the cause of the rash is unknown or if the rash is not being treated
- **CONTAGIOUS ILLNESS:** Such as chicken pox, scabies, ring worm, presence of lice or lice eggs, or other reportable diseases

Please remember to complete and return the Camper Health Examination form and the Camper Health History to CYC prior to your child(ren)'s arrival at camp.

Registration Policies

- Registration incurs a \$100 nonrefundable fee per camper.
- If cancellation is made prior to 10 calendar days of the start date of camp, the balance of camp fees paid (not including the \$100 deposit) will be refunded in the manner paid (credit card, check, etc.).
- Cancellation of camp or bus within 10 days of the start of camp will not yield a refund.
- You may change sessions up to 10 days prior to the start of your session without penalty, as space permits.
- If a camper does not attend due to a Director-approved illness, injury or other situation, the family may choose another 2009 session. If the camper is unable to select another week, the balance of the fees (not including the \$100 deposit) will be returned.
- All camper fees must be paid in full by May 15, 2009. Campers who are not paid in full or do not have payment arrangements established by May 15, 2009 may lose their camp spots. All fees must be paid before the start of camp.

Camper Assistance Fund (Financial Aid)

Financial aid is available for the cost of camp only, up to 50% of camp fees. CYC is unable to fully fund campers. To request a Camper Assistance Fund form and learn of other funding sources, please contact the CYC office after January 15, 2009. Financial aid applications can also be found online. Financial Aid applications are due by April 30, 2009. CYC will notify all applicants of their determinations by May 15, 2009. Payment arrangements can be determined with the registrar. All camp fees must be paid prior to attendance at camp. If payment arrangements are not honored, you will lose the amount already paid. \$100 is due per camper upon application for financial aid. **Financial aid cannot be combined with another other discount.**

Early Bird Registration Discount

Register and **pay in full** by January, 31 2009, and receive \$50 off on 2009 camp tuition (normally \$405, \$355 until 1/31/09). **This applies to every camper and camp session.**

Family/Multi-Session Discount

All families registering for more than one session are eligible for the “multi-session discount” of \$40 off the 2nd and subsequent registrations. This also applies to families with multiple campers. This may be used in combination with the Early Bird discount.

Child Abuse Prevention

1. Our organization has a zero tolerance for any type of abuse. If you witness or feel that your child is in danger of any type of verbal, physical, sexual, or emotional abuse please report to Natalie King, Executive Director 651-636-1645.
2. Staff and volunteers should contact your family regarding camp information through telephone, notes in backpacks, or in person. **Computer communication (emails, chats) to children or families is not permitted (this excludes Camp Director and Executive Director).**
3. Staff and volunteers should not ask children to participate in other activities outside CYC unless previously cleared by the CYC Executive Director and parent or guardian in writing.
4. Staff and volunteers are not allowed to transport children in their own vehicles.
5. Staff and volunteers are not allowed to babysit children (met through CYC) outside the program area unless previously cleared by CYC Executive Director and parents or guardian in writing.
6. Staff and volunteers are not allowed to give special gifts to campers for any reason.

Reducing Homesickness

It is common and natural for new and returning campers to experience some feeling of missing home while at camp. To reduce potential for homesickness, CYC staff work hard to make sure that when each camper arrives, he/she feels comfortable and welcome and knows what will be happening the first day.

If your child shares a concern about missing home, let them know that those feelings are natural and okay, but try not to dwell on his/her concerns. Here are some tips to reduce potential homesickness:

- Work together as a family to plan and pack for camp.
- Practice being away from home by spending a weekend at a friend's house
- Consider arranging for a first-time camper to attend with a close friend, relative, or camp "buddy"
- Do not tell your child in advance that you will "rescue" him/her from camp if he/she doesn't like it
- Discuss what camp will be like before your child leaves, acknowledging feelings- consider role-playing anticipated camp situations such as using a flashlight to find the bathroom.
- Talk enthusiastically with your child about camp activities and experiences
- Encourage them to write home while at camp (pack stationary, envelopes, stamps)
- Let them know you will be sending letters
- Let them know you will miss them, but that you can't wait to hear all about the fun they had at camp.
- Have them bring a "comfort" item from home (stuffed toy, blanket, picture)
- Avoid suggesting they can call home if they are upset
- Share positive camp experiences you had as a child

Parents can call camp at any time to check on their child's well being. However, direct phone contact with campers generally encourages and/or intensifies homesickness and is usually discouraged.

Catholic Youth Camp Welcomes Donations
